MEET THE 2019 NAF CURATORS

ARMISEY SMITH **SPREAD SPECTRUM – A MODULATION OF WOMEN ARTISTS**

– One Theater Square, 2 Center St., Newark

The exhibition looks at the works of women artists via a spectrum of realistic and abstract fine art. The works collectively reflect perspectives of high self-efficacy, internal and external loci of control through content and purpose. The art was curated to explore, and present themes related to the experiences of womens lives.

MARY A. VALVERDE **GRAVITY (ATIONAL)**

– Walker House, 540 Broad St., Newark

This exhibition considers the duality of the word. The concept of what is severe and intense, as well as actual object or materials that are organized or built with their structure utilizing its natural and perceived weight. The artists are interested in the intersection of the conceptual and material through their interdisciplinary practice.

ATIM ANNETTE OTON **WOMEN'S NARRATIVES: BRICK CITY BLUES**

– Hahne's Building, 46 Halsey St., Newark

Women's Narratives: Brick City Blues is an ode to, a celebration, a challenge and a questioning of women's narratives in the context of a racial, socioeconomic and political paradigm shift of the body. This exhibition pivots on the notion of the artist's inner voice, sociopolitical stance and metamorphosis in concept, material and technique.

ONNIE STROTHER AND NETTIE FORNE THOMAS **BLACK WOMAN IN VISUAL PERSPECTIVE**

– Hahne's Building, 46 Halsey St., Newark

BLACK WOMAN IN VISUAL PERSPECTIVE, a historical group of black professional female artists , established in 1972, was the inspiration of Gladys Barker Grauer.



The group remained active through their 10th, 15th, and 20th year anniversaries. In recognition of the founder, Gladys Grauer, receiving the “Women’s Caucus For The Arts” lifetime achievement award, this exhibit will highlight some of the surviving current members. It will also serve as a memorial to her life and art in which she inspired provocation by making a difference.

TERRY BODDIE **REVERENCE + SOUND + MOVEMENT**

– Hahne’s Building, 46 Halsey St., Newark

In the works by the artists Ron Freeman, Amalia Mallard and Eddie Shellman the human being is present and absent, sonic, kinetic and immobile. The impact on the viewer is both physical and psychological. In the sculptural work of Freeman they are traces, indexes of what once was. In Shellman’s site-specific installation they are fully articulated through the physicality of their presence as projected moving figures within a built environment. The sound of laughter is a subversive force in Mallard’s work. She examines the practice of suppressing the laughter of enslaved African during Jim Crow and connecting it to her reexamining and subversion of the Medusa myth.



BRIDGE ART GALLERY **BLACK GIRL MAGIC, POLITICS & THANGS**

– 91 Halsey St., Newark

Cheryl Mack, Co-Owner of The Bridge Art Gallery in Bayonne, curates two exhibitions highlighting the many facets of feminine existence today. “Black Girl Magic, Politics & Thangs” features Maurice Evans’ artwork – weaving a beautiful story of black femininity, strength and power. Creative artists uniquely see the world through a special lens. The “Expressive Creative Soul” group show reflects the beautifully complicated world through the artistic eye.



FEMME CURATOR ARTS **BLACK & BROWN: AN UNPARALLELED TRUTH**

– 744 BROAD ST., NEWARK

Each and every year for the Newark Arts Festival, Femme Curator Arts has led intense, highly favored exhibitions and creative happenings within one of the most creative cities.
